Lakeland – Aaron Driggers, 76, passed away on June 27, 2017.

Mr. Driggers was born in Apopka, FL on July 26, 1940 and remained a lifelong resident of Central Florida. He served in the Army Reserves following his graduation from Plant City High School (linebacker #54 for the Planters) and eventually retired from the Weyerhaeuser company. Mr. Driggers was an avid Florida Gator fan as well as a 50's and 60's music enthusiast. He enjoyed traveling, the outdoors, antique collecting and family gatherings. He also took great pride in supporting the Florida Lottery and casinos across the country.

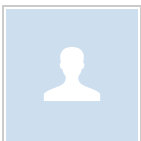
