Memorial service was held on Sunday, March 29, 2015 at 1:00 PM at Gentry-Morrison Funeral Home, Serenity Gardens Chapel.

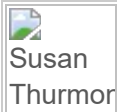

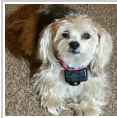
