Tyler David Hall passed away unexpectedly on June 20, 2020 at the age of 21. He was a lifelong resident of Lakeland, Florida. He fulfilled his lifelong dream of going to the University of Florida majoring in Agriculture and Life Sciences.

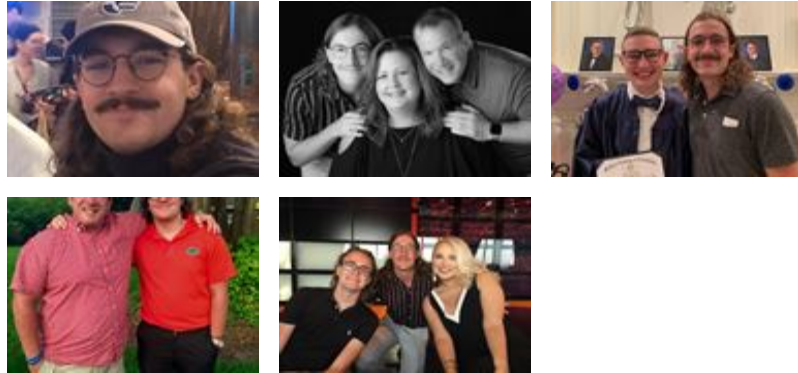

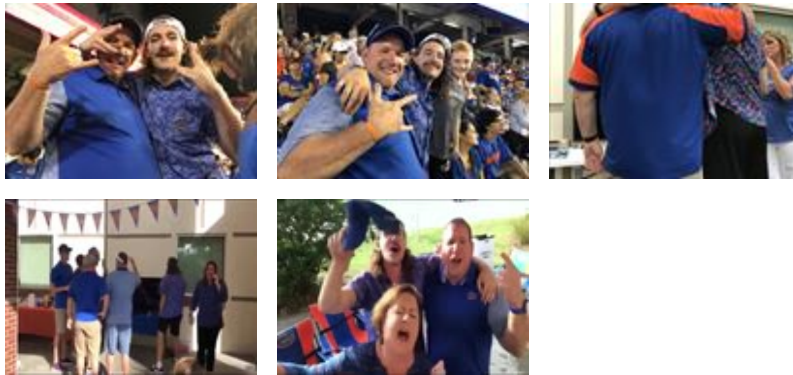
